TWO EMPLOYEES AT TBH RECEIVE DEGREES

Dorchester, Mass. – Lisa Layne and Dieula Marcelin of the nursing staff at The Boston Home in Dorchester — a long-term care facility for adults with physical disabilities, primarily multiple sclerosis and related neurological diseases — have each received an educational degree.

Layne received her Associate R.N. degree from Quincy College, and was previously an L.P.N. in long-term care at the Sherrill House in Boston and Hebrew Rehabilitation in Boston. She received her B.S. in Biology from Northeastern University and is a resident of Dorchester.

Marcelin, a Senior C.N.A. who has been with The Boston Home since 2000 and a C.N.A. in long-term Care since 1998, received her GED from the Boston Public Schools Adult Evening School. Previously, Marcelin spent eight years at Upman's Corner Health Center as a Home Health Aide, four years at Heellenie Nursing Home in Canton, and four years at Don Orione Nursing Home in East Boston. Marcelin is a resident of Mattapan.
